

ABOUT AS YOU LIKE IT



"Live a little..."

Orlando implores Adam to do just that in Act 2, Scene 6, and that's exactly what the play asks of its characters and audience. This beloved Shakespeare comedy has all the bard's best: disguised/mistaken identity (Rosalind as "Ganymede"), intrigue, a villain, and, of course, love. The first scenes take place in "court," a seemingly civilized place. We soon see the tense relationship between brothers Oliver and Orlando, who agrees to wrestle for his fortune. The next scene starts more civilized with cousins Rosalind and Celia preparing to watch the fight. Soon though, Rosalind is banished from the court by her uncle, Duke Frederick, who has usurped the throne from her father, Duke Senior, and banished him to the Forest of Arden. Rosalind, Celia and Touchstone, the court jester, head to the forest to find him—but not before Orlando and Rosalind fall in love at first sight. Orlando flees to the forest, too, upon learning that his brother has plotted to kill him in the wrestling match.

In the forest, Duke Senior and his band of followers relax and reflect on life; Rosalind, disguised as a boy (Ganymede), encounters Orlando, and offers to give him lessons in love. Others find (and get a little lost in) love, too: shepherd Silvius pines for Phebe, who has a thing for Ganymede; and Touchstone woos Audrey, and even Celia is captivated by a surprise suitor.

The plot takes a dramatic turn when Orlando saves his estranged brother, Oliver, from the jaws of a lion, and love wins in the end when Ganymede delivers on a promise to bring Rosalind to Orlando. Father and daughter are reunited, and even Duke Frederick has a change of heart and returns the throne to his brother. Can there be "too much of a good thing," as Ganymede asks Orlando? Not in *As You Like It!*

NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

1969. Neil Armstrong stepped from a tiny space aircraft and took the first step by man onto the surface of the moon. A music festival that exceeded everyone's expectations took place on a dairy farm in Woodstock, NY that attracted more than 350,000 music fans over three days. The Black Power Movement, Vietnam War protests, The Feminist Movement, and college and university student protests were all growing strong as young people struggled to define the ideas of a new culture in American society. Out of this a counter culture of young people called "hippies" was born and the world was forever changed by their message of peace and love. Of course, my list of historic events from this remarkable year is not complete. But these are some of the ideas that lead me to setting our play in 1969. For me, love and peace were the strong messages of that era and in Shakespeare's play, characters portray love in all its glory: the joy of love, the suffering of love, and the attainment of love. Love is simply "a source of incomparable delight." Those who enter the Forest of Arden are transformed and will no doubt leave changed and enlightened for the better. That was indeed the hope of the 60's era. Humankind is still striving for it, and we need it now more than ever. The lovers in this play will take you on a journey that finds the fulfillment of love, and peace with our fellow man...and woman. -Susan Dalian

Some film and tv credits include roles in *Undisputed, The Brothers, The Kid, 90210, What I Like About You, The Hughleys, Star Trek: Voyager* and the voice of "Haku" in *Naruto*. Susan holds a BFA from Boston University and is a proud graduate of Baltimore School for the Arts.

KARRAH MARIE SPITZNAGEL (Stage Manager) is a trained technical theatre, design and production BA student and graduate of California State University, Fullerton, Class of 2013.
